## PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION ORDER

Plaintiffs, who are taking part in a "Rainbow Family" gathering in Chattahoochee National Forest in Lumpkin County, have filed a complaint and motion for temporary restraining order, seeking to restrain Defendant United States Forest Service (the "USFS") from conducting unlawful searches and/or

seizures of persons or vehicles entering Chattahoochee National Forest in Lumpkin County who are participating in a Rainbow Family gathering that is taking place through July 7, 2018.<sup>3</sup> See Docket No. 1.

The Court recognizes the interest of the USFS in protecting and managing National Forest System lands. The Court further recognizes the interest of the USFS in preventing and deterring criminal activity on National Forest System lands. The Court also recognizes that stopping a vehicle – even briefly – and detaining its occupants at a checkpoint constitutes a seizure of those persons within the meaning of the Fourth Amendment of the United States Constitution. And the Court recognizes that a search of a vehicle may also implicate the Fourth Amendment of the United States Constitution.

In entering this Order, the Court has not substantively evaluated the contentions set forth in Plaintiffs' complaint and motion for temporary

restraining order, and this Order does not provide any opinion as to the merits of Plaintiffs' contentions. Moreover, in consenting to this Order, Defendant has not admitted the contentions alleged in the complaint and motion for temporary restraining order.

With the foregoing in mind and with the consent of the parties:

It is HEREBY ORDERED that Defendant USFS is enjoined from establishing or conducting checkpoints in the Chattahoochee National Forest <a href="mailto:except">except</a> as authorized by law in accordance with the Forest Service Law Enforcement Handbook, FSH 5309.11.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the USFS <u>may</u> establish and conduct checkpoints in the Chattahoochee National Forest provided such checkpoints comply with the U.S. Constitution and the laws of the United States as set forth in the Forest Service Law Enforcement Handbook, FSH 5309.11. *See e.g. City of Indianapolis v. Edmond*, 531 U.S. 32, 121 S. Ct. 447 (2000).

It is FURTHER ORDERED that Defendant USFS is enjoined from undertaking any motor vehicle search for criminal purposes without exigent circumstances, probable cause, or reasonable suspicion as set forth in the Forest Service Law Enforcement Handbook, FSH 5309.11.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that Defendant, its agents and its employees shall <u>not</u> be subject to contempt for failure to comply with this Order if such person lacks actual knowledge of this Order at the time of any alleged violation.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that this Order applies to the USFS, its agents and its employees. This Order does not apply to agents or employees of other federal, state or county agencies over whom the USFS has no control.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that this Order shall expire on July 7, 2018, at the close of the Rainbow Family gathering.
